TEAM ROSTER AND PHOTOGRAPHS

NJCAA regulations require that each Regional Champion immediately following regional finals submit the following information by certified mail to NJCAA Executive Director, 1755 Telstar Dr. Suite #103, Colorado Springs, CO 80920.

- 1) A 5 x 7-inch color photograph of your team including identification of players, coaches, etc.
- 2) A complete team roster including all of the information called for on the attached official program roster form. Please include numbers for all uniform sets (home, vist, etc.).
- 3) "Mug" shots and any information on outstanding players which news media can use to publicize your team.

In addition to the above, include any special press releases, individual photos of star players, coaches, etc., for use in pre-tournament publicity.

The importance of sending in team pictures, rosters and statistics cannot be over emphasized. Players, fans and scouts need this information. For your district to be properly included, these must be forwarded as soon as the teams qualify for the district playoffs. Failure to comply not only will cost the team one full day of per diem expenses, but the team will not be listed in the official program.

LODGING DAMAGES REQUIREMENT:

Because of unusual and excessive damage to motels occupied by certain teams participating in the tournament in past years and the problems associated therewith, NJCAA officials have found it necessary to implement the following procedures and requirements:

- 1) Inspection and assessment of the condition of rooms will be done immediately upon arrival of each team and prior to occupancy of the rooms.
- 2) The Coach and Chairman of the NJCAA Baseball Committee will check the condition of all rooms prior to the departure of each team to determine if there was damage and, if so, will assess the extent of damage, which occurred.
- 3) The Chairman will then write Mary Ellen Leicht, Executive Director of the NJCAA, concerning clearance for each college, what damage has occurred, describe the damage and assess the monetary amount required to restore the damage. A satisfactory report of clearance will be required before travel allotment checks are mailed to participating teams from the NJCAA office.

Arrangements have been made with the participating motels to start your team reservations Thursday, May 27th. If you plan to arrive in Grand Junction either before or after May 21st, it is very important that you contact the motel assigned to your team as soon as possible after making your plans for the trip. **(Please schedule your arrival in Grand Junction after 1:00 P.M. on either Wednesday or Thursday. Reminder, check in time is 1:00 P.M. please do not expect rooms before this.)** Many of the motels are booked at this time of year, and housing difficulties may arise unless the motels know the specific date and time you plan to arrive in Grand Junction.

PER DIEM EXPENSES:

Only those players certified as eligible shall be permitted to suit up or play. Per Diem expenses of \$22.00 per man, per day for lodging and meals shall be paid based on a total of not more than twenty (26) players and coaches, representing each team. Per Diem expense allowance commences May 29, 2010 and continues through the day the team is eliminated from the Tournament. At the conclusion of the tournament the NJCAA office will send each team their per diem payment.

TRAVEL EXPENSES:

Major League Baseball, Easton Sporting Goods, and The Grand Junction Baseball Committee have generously contributed this year to help defray the travel expenses of the teams participating in the 2010 NJCAA Championship Baseball World Series.

TRAVEL EXPENSE REPORT

As a requisite to dividing the money for travel, the Major Leagues require that the NJCAA submit an accurate estimate of the total expenses for each team which participates in the NJCAA World Series.

This statement must include expenses for travel, lodging, meals, and necessary miscellaneous expenses from the time the team leaves its home location to travel to Grand Junction, Colorado, to participate in the Tournament, until such time as each team arrives home following completion of its stay in the Tournament. In the event a team voluntarily stays in Grand Junction an extra day or days before traveling home after being eliminated from the Tournament, expenses for meals, lodging, etc. for this extra period should not be included in the team's total estimate of expenses.

Expenses should only be for those people, players, coaches, manager, and officials whom you consider to be an essential part of your traveling squad.

Forms entitled "TEAM EXPENSE REPORTS" are necessary to insure that the NJCAA's consolidated expense report required by the Major Leagues can be received within the time limits requested by them.

You will find attached two (2) copies of the "TEAM EXPENSE REPORTS" form. One is to be kept for your own records; the other is to be filed with Darren Starr, Tournament Information Committee. This must be done before your per diem check is sent to your college.

The TEAM EXPENSE REPORT form requires that the financial statement be an "accurate estimate" of your team's expense. When your stay in the Tournament has been concluded and you are ready to return home, you will know your transportation costs, meals, lodging and miscellaneous costs to that point. You will be able to make a reasonably accurate estimate of what your expenses for meals and lodging will be for your return trip home, include these on the form.

TEAM HOSTS

Service clubs and other organizations in Grand Junction serve as Team Hosts. The Team Hosts will secure a "courtesy" car for each team and will be available to assist the coaches and players of "their" teams during the Tournament. JUCO WORLD SERIES PRE-TOURNAMENT BANQUET

The traditional pre-tournament banquet will be held in the Two Rivers Convention Center, 2nd & Main Street, Grand Junction, Colorado. Tickets are \$40.00 per person--No exceptions. The Banquet is scheduled to start at 7:00 P.M., Friday, May 28th. This year's speaker will be Dave Dravecky. Dravecky played for the San Diego Padres (1982-87) and San Francisco Giants (1987-89). He is well remembered for his battle against cancer, which ended his career as his team was reaching the World Series. He won the Hutch Award in 1989. Dravecky was an all-star in 1983. He finished his 7-year career statistics with 64 wins and 57 losses and ERA of 3.13 and 558 strikeouts. Banquet seating is at a high demand with limited seating. Coaches should call JUCO office, (970) 245-9166, or Banquet chairperson Donna Redd, (970) 263-5707 to make the necessary reservations prior to arrival in Grand Junction, or request the Team Host to do so. The maximum number of tickets per team will be 30 including the 20 complimentary tickets.

Head coaches will be seated at the head table. Please dress appropriately (we recommend coat and tie).

Each team is provided twenty (20) complimentary tickets to the banquet thanks to the NJCAA and Alpine Bank. **While it is not a requirement we strongly encourage your team to attend, I would like to make mention that every national champion has attended the banquet.**

All additional players or guests of teams must pay the regular price of \$40.00 for a banquet ticket. These tickets may be picked up at JUCO headquarters.

A limited number of banquet tickets are available at JUCO headquarters. Headquarters will work to see that parents/guests are located nearby to assigned team tables. Reservations may be made by credit card.

The customary "social hour" preceding the banquet will begin at 6:00 P.M. at Two Rivers Convention Center.

CODE OF CONDUCT FOR TOURNAMENTS SPONSORED BY THE NJCAA:

Within the District Winner's Packets are copies of the NJCAA Code of Conduct, one for each member of your traveling squad. As a coach of a participating team in the NJCAA Baseball World Series, you must recognize and assume responsibility for the conduct of your team members. The NJCAA requires that you inform each team member of the Code, and further, that each team member is given a printed copy of the Code of Conduct for NJCAA Tournaments.

RULES OF PLAY:

All games will be played under NCAA rules, except for the following changes or additions to these rules, which have been adopted by the NJCAA for Tournament, play:

- a. All games are scheduled for nine (9) innings.
- b. The ten run (10-run) rule shall be in effect after five (5) complete innings.
- c. The eight run (8 run) rule shall be in effect after seven (7) complete innings.
- d. The Championship Game (game #19) shall be played the full nine (9) innings regardless of the score.
- e. Any game delayed because of rain, power failure, etc., shall be resumed at the point of suspension and played a full nine- (9) innings unless terminated under rule b or c above.
- f. Optional substitution provision will not apply to Tournament play.
- g. The Home Team will be determined by the flip of a coin prior to each game. The Home Team will occupy the third base dugout. The tournament directors reserve the right to handle the flip even without team representation as the case may arise. Every effort will be made for a team representative to be present. (Team representatives is defined as any member of the coaching staff)
- h. Tournament Umpires are instructed to keep games moving and will strictly enforce charged conference/pitcher removal rules.
- i. Rules require that double earflap helmets be worn at bat and on the bases.
- j. PROTESTS: No protests will be tolerated on judgment calls. Rule interpretation protests will be decided immediately by the Tournament Director, the NJCAA Representative and the supervisor of officials (if available). The game shall then proceed immediately.
- k. Official Line up Cards, in duplicate, is to be submitted to the Umpire-In-Chief before each game.
- l. Open Wound Policy: Under circumstances when constant or profuse bleeding occurs, the appropriate team official following NCAA Baseball Rules may attend the participant. Should bleeding not be controlled immediately, the player shall be removed from the game.

SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

- a. In the event of unavoidable delays due to weather or other unforeseen causes, the Tournament officials and NJCAA Representative reserves the right to reschedule game times, schedule seven (7) inning games, schedule a team(s) for two games in one day, or other arrangements as necessary. Coaches will be kept closely advised of any changes.
- b. If a participating institution has a written policy against Sunday competition, the tournament schedule shall be adjusted to accommodate that institution and such adjustment shall not require its team to play sooner than when it was originally scheduled. Notice of such written policy must be filed with the NJCAA National Office prior to September 1st, each academic year. Alternate brackets may be found in the 1996-Minute Book.

OTHER TOURNAMENT REQUIREMENTS AND INFORMATION:

- a. **THE USE OF TOBACCO PRODUCTS IS NOT PERMITTED BY ANY PLAYER OR COACH** on the playing field or in the dugouts. This rule also applies to umpires and any other game official or host on the field or in the dugouts.
- b. Players not actively involved in the play are to remain in the dugouts and/or bullpen areas. No players are allowed on the top of the dugouts. On-deck hitter is the only player permitted out of the dugout, and he must stand in marked area.
- c. Bats are to be kept in provided bat racks only; all other equipment in or on the dugout.
- d. No pre-game hitting practice can be taken on the Stadium Field.
- e. "HOME TEAM" will take pre-game hitting practice at Mesa State College Bus Bergman Practice Field 2 hours before game time and will take pre-game infield/outfield warm up FIRST (1ST).
- f. "VISITING TEAM" will take pre-game hitting practice at Canyon View Field 2 hours before game time and will take pre-game infield/outfield warm-up SECOND (2ND).
- g. The official NJCAA roster and team personnel will be turned in at the **Mandatory** meeting on Friday. Maximum of 26 players. (1) head coach, (4) assistant coaches, (1) trainer and (1) manager. **No other team personnel will be allowed to enter.**
- h. Pre-game infield/outfield warm ups are to be limited to ten (10) minutes with only **two (2) players at each position.**

- i. Starting pitchers, relief pitchers or other players, are to warm up only in the bullpen; pitching mounds and plates are provided.
- j. Parking at the Stadium: A special parking lot for team cars only is available on the north side (North Avenue) of the Stadium. A special "bus only" parking area is also available on the northwest corner of the main parking lot near the horseshoe pits and tennis courts.
- k. Telephones are installed in each dugout. Please use these phones to inform the press box/official scorer of line-up changes, pinch hitters, etc., after officially reporting them to the Umpire in Chief.
- l. Bat boys/girls must be at least eleven (11) years of age and wear hard helmets when working. Bat boys/girls for each team will be provided by the JUCO tournament committee.
- m. When entering and exiting field during your team's game, please use left field foul line gate.
- n. Tournament passes for all players and coaches will be issued at JUCO headquarters upon teams check in. No one may enter the field of play without one. (Player passes are non-transferable, and for players use only!)
- o. All logos and lettering such as "JUCO World series" are owned copyrights by the software committee. None may be reproduced or sold without permission of the Software Committee and the vendor holding the production contract. All requests or questions should be directed to Bill Byers, chairman, Software Committee, JUCO, P.O. Box 2535, Grand Junction, CO 81502.
- p. Team line ups are due 30 minutes before game time! They are needed for PA announcer and media. Line up shall be given to official tournament runner.

TOURNAMENT BRACKET:

Study the bracket carefully. It shows whom you will play in your first game, the dates and times of each game as the tournament progresses. Two losses are required for elimination.

Any team(s) that have a "No Sunday play" policy. Must notify the NJCAA headquarters of that policy by September 1st of each year. In the event a school(s) that qualifies for the baseball tournament and the proper notification has been made to the NJCAA, a special tournament bracket will be implemented.

If there are three teams remaining at Game 18, the team with the most games played shall receive a bye to Game 19. If there is a tie for most games played, a coin toss will be used to determine the bye.

GAME PHYSICIANS:

A game physician will be assigned and available during each game of the Tournament. Requests for medical assistance should be made to the Tournament Directors. A listing of specific doctors to be on hand or available during each Tournament Game will be supplied each team coach in the packet which should be picked up at Tournament Headquarters immediately upon arrival in Grand Junction.

TOURNAMENT HEADQUARTERS:

Tournament Headquarters will be located at the Clarion Inn, 755 Horizon Drive, (970) 243-6790 and will be open May 27, 2010 from 8:00 to 5:00, and May 28, 2010 from 8:00 to 4:00. Team packets, parent/guests banquet tickets, tournament game tickets, press packets, and other Tournament information will be available there. Coaches must check in at headquarters upon arrival. The Clarion Inn will also serve as the Official Tournament Hotel and will house the tournament officials and other NJCAA guests.

TOURNAMENT TICKETS:

Advance saving tournament tickets for all games may be purchased at JUCO Headquarters. Ticket is good for all games-all week. Adults \$25.00, Students (Ages 6-21) Seniors (55 and older) \$20.00. Children 5 years of age and younger are free. Checks & Credit cards accepted. Single game tickets available only at baseball park ticket booths.

TOURNAMENT DIRECTORS:

Jamie Hamilton, Walt Bergman, and Matt Hyde will decide all details and matters pertaining to the actual conduct of the Tournament. At least one (1) of these men will be on hand on the field at all times during the course of Tournament play.

PRE-GAME INTRODUCTION AND SPECIAL EVENTS:

There will be brief programs or special introductions made immediately preceding the 7:30 P.M. game each night of the Tournament. These include a special introduction of the coaches of the participating teams the first night.

It is required that all coaches report to the area immediately behind and beneath the home plate grandstand at approximately 7:15 P.M. opening night.

Coaches of teams participating in the 7:30 P.M. games will be kept closely advised of such programs by the Tournament Directors for warm up purposes.

The Championship games will have teams introduced from the P.A. and require teams to line up on the field prior to the game.

UMPIRES:

Three (3) or Four (4) umpires will be assigned to work each game with the exception of the Championship game to which six (6) umpires will be assigned. All umpires have been selected and approved by the NJCAA from among the best semi-pro and college umpires available in the United States.

The supervisor of officials (Dr. Jim Paronto) will schedule umpires during tournament play.

BASEBALLS:

Official NJCAA baseballs for the Tournament are being furnished by the Rawlings Sporting Goods Company.

PRACTICE FIELDS:

Each team will be allowed a one and half (1 1/2) hour practice session on the Walter "Bus" Bergman Athletic Field located at Mesa State College, 10th and Orchard Avenue, or Canyon View Field located at Canyon View Park, Interstate 70 and 24 Road on Friday, May 28th. No practice will be permitted on the Main Tournament Diamond. The schedule for the first day of practices is as follows:

Once the Tournament begins (May 29th) a separate practice schedule for both fields will be made available to each team. This schedule will be given to each Coach at the time of his first practice on May 28th and will be geared to the time and date of each game as the Tournament progresses. Please study this week long schedule and coordinate times with your team host.

During the tournament pre-game hitting practice, the **Home** team will hit 2 hours before game time at Bergman Field. The **Visiting** team will hit 2 hours before game time at Canyon View Field.

Toward the end of the tournament when only three or four teams are still competing, pre game hitting times may be scheduled for the same practice field only if both coaches agree.

Bergman Field:

1. All practices must be scheduled through Tex Tolman (245-3166 or 201-3377 fax 245-0685 and colo4rado@bresnan.net).
2. Teams arriving in Grand Junction one or more days prior to Friday, May 28th must schedule earlier practices with Tex Tolman. All practices will be limited to (1) one hour. Teams will be scheduled for this earlier period on a "first come, first serve" basis.
3. All warm up throwing should be done north to south to prevent overthrows from going over the fence into private yards.

4. All hitting from the main plate area must be done with the portable cage in place. Please place cage to insure all foul balls stay in the cage, to protect houses along the street.
5. Batting practice pitchers and infield 'fungo' hitters must use the rubber mats provided. No pitching off the grass in front of the mound is permitted please use portable mounds provided by grounds crew.
6. On-deck hitters must stay on field pads to prevent excess grass damage.
7. All non-team members must stay out of the dugout area for safety purposes. Coaches must enforce this rule.
8. The enclosed hitting cage north of the field is usable, but hitters must wear turf or tennis shoes only.
9. Teams may warm up (stretch) prior to their scheduled practice time on the far southern or eastern part of the practice complex.
10. If coaches want to practice twice in one day, the second practice time will be granted only after all other teams are given "their first choice."

Canyon View Field:

1. This field is maintained by the City Parks & Recreation grounds crew, Field rules will be posted to insure proper use.
2. A tournament official will be present at all practice times and will assist with any problems or answer any questions.
3. All practices times will be scheduled through Tex Tolman (245-3166 or 201-3377) to prevent mistakes in scheduling.
4. Once the tournament starts, those teams with byes will be given choice of those practice times not conflicting with pre-game hitting. As soon as coaches know of their "bye" schedule they should contact "Tex" for practice times the following day.
5. If coaches want to practice twice in one day, the second practice time will be granted only after all other teams are given "their first choice."

PRE-TOURNAMENT YOUTH BASEBALL CLINIC

For the 9th year the American Baseball Coaches Association and the Grand Junction Baseball Committee are proud to give back to the youth of the Grand Junction community by hosting a baseball clinic. With the help of the coaches and players of the 2010 qualifying teams, kids and parents will be taught the basics of the game of baseball. The clinic will be held Thursday May 27, 2010 from 5:00 P.M. – 7:00 P.M. at Suplizio Field (Stoker Stadium).

NJCAA TROPHIES AND SPECIAL AWARDS:

- a. Official NJCAA Trophies are awarded to the teams who place 1st, 2nd, and (2) 3rds. Provided by US Bank of Grand Junction.
- b. D.S. Dykstra participation plaques presented to each of the other six- (6) teams. Provided by Grand Junction Lions Club.
- c. Special 2010 NJCAA Baseball Tournament "Shoulder Patches" and participation certificates for each team member will be included in the respective team (coaches) packets which are available at Tournament Headquarters. Gene Taylors Sporting Goods of Grand Junction provides (Shoulder Patches).

The following special awards will be presented immediately after the Championship game.
